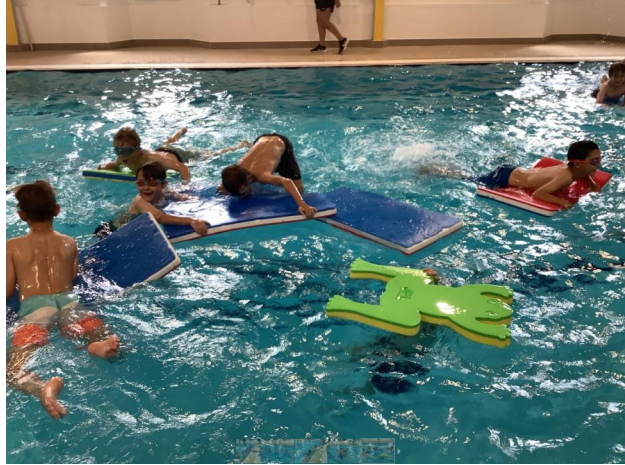

Key Stage 1 SATS

As part of the National Curriculum, KS1 SATs will take place for Year Two children during the week commencing **Monday 23rd June**. Alongside teacher assessments, the results provide information about your child's progress and attainment in **reading, writing, mathematics and spelling, punctuation and grammar**.

It is extremely important to us that all children feel comfortable and relaxed and we aim to make the experience as positive as possible by encouraging all children to do their best.

To support your child at home you can;

- Encourage a positive attitude toward school and learning.
- Continue regular reading at home.
- Ensure your child gets plenty of rest and maintains a routine.
- Reassure them that they just need to try their best.

Year 1 Phonic Screening Check

Y1 Phonics Screening Check – Final Tips

The Phonics Screening Check will take place during the week commencing **Monday 9th June**. Here are some last-minute tips to support your child:

- Find 10 minutes per day to watch RWI Virtual Classroom films using the QR codes sent home before half-term.
- Please prioritise any highlighted sounds – these are ones your child finds tricky and will benefit most from practising.
- The Word Challenge films help your child practise the ‘Special friends, Fred talk’ routines with a mix of real and nonsense words – great practice for the screening check.
- Keep reading at least three times a week. Choose a quiet time when your child is wide awake. Help your child to:
 - Read the sounds and words at the front of the book, before they read the story.
 - Sound out any unfamiliar words as they read the story.
 - Read back each page to them, after they have read it.
 - If your child has enjoyed the story, encourage them to read it again on the next day to increase their fluency.

Multiplication Check Last Minute Tips!

Some last-minute practise that I would advise would be to revise the tables that your child is not as confident with and ensure these are practised out of order as the tables check is randomly generated. We are a team of qualified and trainee Educational Mental Health Practitioners (EMHPs) and Supervisors, supported by Team and Service Managers. Together, we have a wealth of experience in supporting children and young people with their mental health.
